PASTOR'S PRELUDE "Thy Will Be Done" That's the title for our Lenten series. The information included about the series states, "Not as I will, but as you will," Jesus prayed to his Father the night before he went to the cross for our salvation. And that is our prayer as well this Lent as we seek to do God's will in our lives, as we draw near to the observance of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection during Holy Week. The series is written by Rev. Justin Rossow, and each service focuses on a different aspect of God's will at working among us. Biblical characters are used as insightful reference points each week to guide us in following our Lord more nearly day by day.'

We meet up with others who have trusted the will of God: Abraham and Isaac, Moses, David, Mary, Paul, Lydia, as well as reflecting on our own lives and our trust in the will of God, our service, God's Will Is Done (Good Friday), and for Easter Sunday, God's Will for the New Creation. We will also have a six-week Community Bible Study entitled "Thy Will Be Done", which will include scripture readings about the Biblical characters, questions for discussion, and prayers that will guide us in our quest to seek God's will in all aspects of our lives – our identity, our dreams for the future, our worldview, and our response to Christ the Crucified. As an additional resource, we will have a devotional book by Rev. Ted Schroeder, "Thy Will Be Done", which will also follow along with the Biblical characters and themes for our worship services and Bible Study.

It has been said that I'm a "strong-willed person." At times my parents called that something else! But I know that to be true about myself. I know that at times I have thought that I had the better plan and stepped out on that path only to find that there were many forks in the road and unexpected twists and turns and obstacles along the way. There were certainly numerous times when I felt "stopped in my tracks." I had to pull back and ask myself is this my stubbornness and strong will that's leading me, or am I really willing to seek God's will and have the sense (*and the knowing*) that God was my guide for my life's journey? I really do want it to be God's will, and to have the strength and strong will to be on that path, to fully trust God! And yes, I know there will continue to be those twists and turns, those obstacles along the way, but I truly believe in my "heart of hearts" that God will be with me as I find myself confronted and slowed by these, and promises to get me to the other side of these. **Will it be easy? Likely not! Will it be comfortable? Likely not! Will it be scary? Perhaps!** But it is truly Good News (*gospel news*) that God promises to be with me always! Jesus doesn't make promises that he doesn't keep, as has been true for all the covenants that God has made; we'll encounter those and be reminded of God's covenants during the Sundays in Lent. I hope you will be "willing" to participate in this Lenten journey – it's going to happen whether you decide to be or not! I hope you are "willing" to reflect on God's will for you and are you open to saying, "Thy Will Be Done!" I hope that you will find time to worship, to pray, to study, and to come and see what God has in store for us in the 40 days of Lent, the ways we can be present in Holy Week, from entering Jerusalem to the Cross, and to the empty tomb on Easter. Our faith life is one of active participation, not a spectator from the sidelines. We can take this journey together! That's good news, too!

MEDICAL UPDATE—01/29/18 HEART OF HEARTS

I'm grateful that in my heart of hearts I'm in remission. January, 2017 brought me into my third bout of battling this ovarian cancer that invaded my life almost five years ago. With this bout came allergic reactions to the chemo, ugly hives and more pain, and the residuals from all the cycles of chemo have left in their wake some physical debilitation that I now am more realistically coming to terms with. My "bounce back" hasn't been what I had hoped for and I'm trying to be more honest with myself that there are some limitations that may well be more permanent. I'm trying to be grateful for the information that I was given years ago by Dr. Kushner, my oncologist-surgeon at UW Madison, when he said that there would likely come a time when I had decide on just how debilitating would I allow myself to become in the course of treatment. He said that there were times when the treatment was worse than the disease, and one would need to decide at what point was enough-enough. I have said all along that I would do whatever it takes to battle this back in to remission. I still feel that way, but I'm more realistic about the toll that it is taking. It's unsettling to be honest about the pain level this has reached and what it takes in medications and other aids to lessen this, to wish that I could just "pop up" from where I'm sitting and that I have to painstakingly get to an upright position and step out, or that wanting to do something and then having the stamina to do those things are compromised. It's not the "worst thing in the world", it's just not what I had hoped for or expected. I'm not happy with the limitations it has placed on me at this time. But I'm not giving up on the possibilities of improvement.

I still haven't made it back to water therapy – winter and its bitter cold causes me to find that as an excuse to not go at this time. So I'm recommitting to getting on this by mid-February ... perhaps it can be what I do for my Lenten practice. My chiropractor, who works with my primary physician, has shown me how to do a webbing pattern with kinesiology tape on my thighs and knees to see if that brings about more blood flow and reduces the inflammation, especially to my knees, but to the soft tissue as well. That's an experiment in progress. It helped with the healing of the injuries to my shins when I fell and had deep bone bruises and wounds that were not otherwise healing from a fall. And I refuse to not move to get where I need to go. It may be slower than I want, but I will get there. It does make me also think about other aids that I stubbornly think I don't need, but perhaps to get to do what I want, it may take other means to help with the mobility. I'm also looking at what has contributed to this debilitation, and some of this has to do with the lymph nodes that were removed and where the toxins now are "dumped." So many things that one doesn't think too much about over the course of life as our bodies are handling this automatically. My body is processing lots of things differently than it had, from how my gut treats digestion, etc..., to copying with bulging discs in my lumbar spine, and arthritis and neuropathy.

I'm grateful for being remission, grateful to be off chemo, grateful for much improved numbers in almost every category. My kidneys are a bit crabby because of the anti-inflammatory meds I take. But my liver is much improved, and I have a CA-125 at 11.6, which is great, and well within the normal range. I am grateful for Dr. Einhorn and others who medically oversee things, that he has "plans" should I need a new "battle plan" in the future. I'm grateful for you, my Great Cloud of Witnesses", and that I don't journey alone, and grateful to God for the promise that I am never alone or forsaken. What a great promise! And in my heart of hearts, I know all of this to be true! So I say, "stay tuned" and I'll keep up updated on what's next. Thanks for your love, care, and support on this journey!
